

Welcome to Moor Hey School




This booklet is written to help any new pupil settle into our school routines





Assembly


There is a primary assembly on Wednesday in Class 2. Mondays and Fridays are whole school assemblies.

Breakfast club

This is open from 8.40am every morning if you need to buy your breakfast.

Break

To encourage healthy eating children are only allowed to bring fruit or crisps to eat at break time. No sweets or chocolate allowed.



Dinners

School dinners are served in the hall (except for Class 1 and Class 2 which are served in the classroom) or you can bring your own packed lunch.

Dinner money is paid each week on a Monday - £2.20 a day (cheques made payable to Lancashire County Council).

Milk

All the children are allowed milk. This is paid at the end of each term for the next term. (No charge is made to those on free school meals.)

Homework

Homework, when set, may take on a variety of forms. It could include reading books and shared reading.

Please make sure your name is in all your uniform

We feel strongly that school uniform is correct, clean and neat at all times. We have regular uniform checks and many visitors comment on how smart our pupils look. We do not allow earrings, bracelets, necklaces or finger rings for boys or girls. Hairstyles should not be too short or extreme.

Movement around the school.

It is very important to move safely around the school.
This means that you should always walk, not run.

Use doors safely.

Move quietly around the building at all times so you do not disturb others.

When the bell rings at the end of playtime and dinner play, line up quietly in classes.

This all sounds a lot to remember but it is quite easy.
All the children very quickly learn the routine and manage well. We are sure you will be the same.

Remember, there is always a member of staff nearby to help or tell you what to do.

If you are anxious about a situation, or another pupil,
tell a teacher.
