### School Mission Statement

Moor Hey School is an inclusive school where we work together to provide a caring and supportive environment to meet and celebrate the diverse abilities and needs of all our pupils, enabling them to fulfil their personal, social, moral and academic potential.

### School Aims

- To provide a broad, balanced and relevant curriculum differentiated to meet individual needs.
- To encourage and promote understanding of each pupil's individual needs.
- To raise self-esteem through a positive approach to teaching & learning.
- To develop and enhance appropriate social skills in a range of contexts.
- To increase independence for life.

The majority of our admissions take place in September but they may be made at any time during the year. Prospective parents and their children are encouraged to visit us and see what we have to offer - to experience the school at work.

Places are offered subject to agreement of the Local Authority Admissions Panel; availability and suitability; and only if parents/carers feel they can support the school values and ethos. We believe the key to success at Moor Hey School is working together with parents, staff and other professionals to assist young people in achieving their very best in all aspects of development.

A pupil would normally have a statement or EHCP (Education Health Care Plan) which identifies a specific learning difficulty or disability and the required level of educational and/or other support to meet the need(s) and or outcomes.

Following admission a pupil's progress in regard to the statement or plan is reviewed at least annually and as part of that review process a review of placement can be made.

Parents are asked to inform the school immediately of any change of address and/or telephone number. A registration form is provided so that we have pupil details such as emergency contact numbers, medical needs, etc.
